Abstract

She is an honorary research fellow at CSDS and also teaches at the ILI, and is a quest lecturer in several universities. She is an advisor to several NGO and international organizations such as Amnesty International and the WHO. She is also the South Asia Editor of the Law Environment and Development Journal published by IELRC and SOAS.

Ravi Shukla is a software engineer with two decades of experience in the global software industry, in recent years; Ravi Shukla has been exploring the relationship between technologies, governance and society. He is currently completing his Phd thesis in Science, Technology and Society (STS) Studies from the Centre for Studies in Science Policy (CSSP), Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Delhi. His attempt is to 'uncover mechanisms to interpret and render technologies as inherently sociotechnical processes'.
