## ANATOMY OF A RESEARCH



Nina Wintermeyer is a master's student of English-Speaking Cultures at the Julius Maximilians University of Würzburg, where she has completed a Bachelor of Arts in English and American literary and cultural studies, and political and social studies. She has been awarded the JMU-Flagler Transatlatic Culture Junior Fellowship, Flagler College, St. Augustine, Florida in Fall 2022. Her research revolves around intersectional feminist literary and cultural theory, as well as Shakespeare studies, academic activism, and post- and anti-colonial thought.
