





RANJIT HOSKOTE

Ranjit Hoskote is a poet, cultural theorist, translator and curator. Hoskote curated India's first-ever national pavilion at the Venice Biennale (2011) and was co-curator, with Okwui Enwezor and Hyunjin Kim, of the 7 th Gwangju Biennale (2008). Since 1993, he has curated numerous exhibitions of visual art, both in India and internationally. He has been honoured with such prestigious awards as the Sahitya Akademi Golden Jubilee Award, the Sahitya Akademi Translation Award, the Sanskriti Award for Literature, the S H Raza Award for Literature, and the 7th Mahakavi Kanhaiyalal Sethia Award for Poetry. He has been a fellow of the International Writing Program, University of Iowa, and has held writing residencies across Europe.

GITHA HARIHARAN

Githa Hariharan has written novels, short fiction and essays over the last three and a half decades. Her highly acclaimed work includes the novels The Thousand Faces of Night which won the Commonwealth Writers Prize for Best First Book in 1993. he is the author of the short story collection The Art of Dying and the essay collection Almost Cities and Other Home: Hariharan has, over the years, been a cultural commentator through essays, lectures and activism. In 1995, Hariharan challenged Minority and Guardianship discriminatory against women. The case, Githa Hariharan and Another vs. Reserve Bank of India and Another, led to a landmark Supreme Court judgment in 1999 on guardianship.
