ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

FDP BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

Health communication is integral to the effective public health response to the continuing threat posed by communicable and non communicable diseases in all parts of the world. Public health practitioners, programme managers and policymakers need to be aware of what is known about the strengths, weaknesses and costs of health communication interventions aimed at the prevention and control of communicable and non communicable diseases so that impacts can be enhanced and opportunities maximised for strengthening evidence-informed action. Paradoxically, the discipline remains misunderstood and underutilized. Communication is too often neglected and only incorporated into public health programmes as an afterthought.

A wide variety of professionals are involved, to varying extents, in health communication, but there is a lack of clarity and little consistency about where the responsibility for health communication lies. There is a need for a coherent and coordinated approach to build on the expertise, knowledge and evidence that currently exists to enhance health communication to improve health and reduce health inequalities. The development and maintenance of an online platform for disseminating relevant resources and materials would support the advancement of a quality strategy for the promotion of health communication.

The proposed programme shall empower the young and mid-career professionals to enhance their knowledge about health communication and its importance in the domain of public health.
