About the Speaker

Moeed W. Yusuf is Director, South Asia programmes at the United States Institute of Peace. By training a political scientist, Yusuf has worked extensively on issues relating to South Asian politics, Pakistan's foreign policy, U.S-Pakistan relationship, nuclear deterrence and non-proliferation, and human security and development in South Asia. Before joining USIP, Yusuf was a Fellow at the Frederick S. Pardee Centre for the Study of the Longer-Range Future at Boston University, and concurrently a Research Fellow at the Mossavar-Rahmani Centre at Harvard Kennedy School. He has also been affiliated with the Brookings Institution as a special guest.

Yusuf taught in Boston University's Political Science and International Relations Departments as a Senior Teaching Fellow in 2009. He had previously taught at the Defence and Strategic Studies Department at Quaid-e-Azam University, Islamabad. He is the editor of *Insurgencies and Counterinsurgencies in South Asia* (U.S. Institute of Peace Press, 2014) and *Pakistan's Counterterrorism Challenge* (Georgetown University Press, 2014). He writes regularly for *DAWN*, Pakistan's leading English weekly and appears frequently on Pakistani and U.S media.
